LEGISLATIVE ORDER OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL (Calling on Rep. Timothy L. Joaquin to Immediately Resign from the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council and Repay the Branch for Unauthorized Expenditures)

LEGISLATIVE ORDER NO. 24-152

| 1 | WHEREAS, | "The Tohono O'odham Council shall elect from among its own membership a |
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| 2 | | chairman and vice-chairman. The chairman, or in his absence, the vice- |
| 3 | | chairman shall preside at all meetings of the council, shall perform all duties of |
| 4 | | a chairman and exercise any authority delegated to him by the council." |
| 5 | | (Constitution of the Tohono O'odham Nation, Article V, Section 4); and |
| 6 | WHEREAS, | the Legislative Council delegates to the Council chairperson authority to |
| 7 | | "Allocate funds, staff, and other resources for the effective operation of the |
| 8 | | Legislative Branch," "Approve Legislative Branch expenditures," and "Supervise |
| 9 | | and delegate the supervision of Legislative Branch employees." Legislative Order |
| 10 | | No. 06-047; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, | the Standards of Conduct for Legislative Council Representatives and Alternates |
| 12 | | adopted by Legislative Order No. 23-022 require all Council representatives to |
| 13 | | "Only use or authorize the use of branch vehicles and equipment for business |
| 14 | | purposes and comply with vehicle, travel, and other policies." Standards, II.(I); |
| 15 | | and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, | the Standards of Conduct further require, "Council Representatives shall not use |
| 17 | | their official position to improperly secure information, privileges, or benefits |
| 18 | | for themselves or others which they are not otherwise entitled by law to receive." |
| 19 | | Standards, I(C); and |
| 20 | WHEREAS, | Representative Timothy L. Joaquin served as Legislative Council chairman from |
| 21 | | June 17, 2011 until his resignation on May 18, 2023 (Legislative Order No. 23-156 |
| 22 | | "Accepting Resignation of Rep. Timothy L. Joaquin as Legislative Council |
| 23 | | Chairperson"); and |
| 24 | WHEREAS, | by Legislative Order No. 16-039, the Legislative Council directed then-Chairman |
| 25 | | Joaquin to "prepare and implement an updated credit card policy to govern the |
| 26 | | use of credit cards issued to the Legislative Council officers and administrative |
| 27 | | staff"; and |
| 28 | WHEREAS, | on January 29, 2016, then-Chairman Joaquin issued the Legislative Branch Credit |
| 29 | | Card Policy, which requires a Council officer or employee who is issued a credit |
| 30 | | card to "retain and submit detailed receipts for each credit card purchase |
| 31 | | appearing on the monthly statement" and to justify questionable expenses in |
| 32 | | writing or lose credit card privileges and immediately reimburse the Branch; and |

WHEREAS.

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- WHEREAS, the Legislative Branch Credit Card Policy requires that in the "case of meals for an official government purpose, the receipt shall include the names of all persons involved in the purchase, and a brief description of the government purpose."

 Credit Card Policy Section 6(B); and
- WHEREAS, the Credit Card Policy also requires that, "Separate electronic files, which shall include copies of the monthly statements and all receipts submitted, shall be created and maintained by designated Legislative Branch staff for each credit card." Credit Card Policy Section 6(C); and
- WHEREAS, Representative Joaquin, in his capacity as Council chairman and a credit card holder, was required to satisfy all requirements for credit card expenses and to ensure that electronic files mandated by the Credit Card Policy were kept by the Legislative Branch administration; and
- WHEREAS, as a Legislative Council representative, Representative Joaquin also was required by the Legislative Branch Travel Policy to complete a travel request authorization form for each trip, submit travel expense reports supported by receipts within seven working days, submit an overall written report within ten working days of each trip, and distribute the written travel report "to the Legislative Council at the next general session" as required by the Legislative Branch Travel Policy, Procedures, I and V.C. (2013); and
- WHEREAS, the Nation's Judicial Court has recognized,

 In order [for the Legislative Council] to legislate properly and supervise
 the functions of the Executive and administrative agencies, it must be
 thoroughly informed. In short, it must have the power to investigate. The
 - scope of its power can be as penetrating and far reaching as the power to make laws, and, is proper under the Constitution.

(Francisco v. Toro, 1 TOR3d 68, 75 (Trial Ct. Jan. 12, 1989); and

in May 2023, the Legislative Rules and Budget and Finance Committees received allegations that from 2021 to 2023, then-Chairman Joaquin directed staff to pay monthly statements for his assigned credit card without providing receipts or required written statements verifying the purpose of purchases and otherwise violated the Legislative Branch's credit card, travel, and vehicle policies and requirements that are designed to provide accountability and protect the Nation's funds and other assets; and

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| 1 | WHEREAS, | in response, the Rules and Budget and Finance Committees informed then- |
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| 2 | | Chairman Joaquin in writing of the allegations, and requested copies of all the |
| 3 | | receipts and documentation required by the Legislative Branch policies from |
| 4 | | May 1, 2021 to May 2023 and written justifications for charges that were |
| 5 | | questionable; and |
| 6 | WHEREAS, | then-Chairman Joaquin responded to the Rules and Budget and Finance |
| 7 | | Committees with various documents, including an incomplete record of |
| 8 | | purchase requisitions and supporting documents for credit card expenditures; |
| 9 | | and |
| 10 | WHEREAS, | by additional correspondence, the Rules and Budget and Finance Committees |
| 11 | | informed then-Chairman Joaquin that the documents provided in response to |
| 12 | | the Committees' initial letter were insufficient, did not meet the requirements of |
| 13 | | the Legislative Branch policies, and the Credit Card Policy therefore required |
| 14 | | him to immediately reimburse the Branch; and |
| 15 | WHEREAS, | when presented with a proposed legislative order removing Chairman Joaquin as |
| 16 | | Council chairman in light of the allegations, the Committees' investigation, and |
| 17 | | Representative Joaquin's inability to provide required documentation or |
| 18 | | justification for travel and expenditures, Representative Joaquin resigned as |
| 19 | | Council chairman (Legislative Order No. 23-156 "Accepting Resignation of Rep. |
| 20 | | Timothy L. Joaquin as Legislative Council Chairperson"); and |
| 21 | WHEREAS, | by Legislative Order No. 23-329, the Legislative Council supported an |
| 22 | | independent audit, under the Council officers' direction, of compliance with the |
| 23 | | Legislative Branch Credit Card Policy and other policies, including the Travel |
| 24 | | Policy; and |
| 25 | WHEREAS, | Legislative Order No. 23-329 also directed the Council officers to determine, |
| 26 | | hased on available information, whether action is necessary to comply with the |
| 27 | | Standards of Conduct for Legislative Council Representatives and Alternates; and |
| 28 | WHEREAS, | on August 31, 2023, the Legislative Branch engaged Keegan Linscott & Associates, |
| 29 | | an independent forensic accounting firm, to provide forensic accounting |
| 30 | | services and evaluate compliance with the Legislative Branch Credit Card Policy, |
| 31 | | Travel Policy, and other policies; and |
| 32 | WHEREAS, | on May 30, 2024, Keegan Linscott & Associates presented to the Legislative Council |
| 33 | | the Legislative Branch Phase I Audit Report ("Audit Report"), which detailed |
| 34 | | significant and repeated violations of Legislative Branch policies by then- |

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Chairman Joaquin, including expenditures of Branch funds during multiple, personal trips to the Indian National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas, Nevada that lacked a business purpose, regular and repeated expenditures of Branch funds for fuel for his personal vehicle, approximately \$27,450.00 in meals and fuel charges without a documented business purpose or meals without a required list of attendees to verify authorized expenditures, and more than \$436,000.00 in charges on his assigned credit card that lacked a documented husiness purpose, were not supported by receipts or other required documentation or justification, or did not otherwise comply with the Credit Card Policy that Chairman Joaquin adopted or other policies he was responsible for enforcing; and Representative Joaquin was (1) provided notice of the allegations, (2) interviewed

WHEREAS, Representative Joaquin was (1) provided notice of the allegations, (2) interviewed by Keegan Linscott & Associates and provided the opportunity to respond to the allegations and provide records and documentation required by Branch policies, (3) provided advance notice of the Council session addressing the Audit Report, and (4) provided the opportunity to respond to the allegations; and

WHEREAS, based upon the detailed, independent Audit Report findings of significant and repeated violations of Legislative Branch policies by Representative Joaquin during his term as Council chairman, repeated and significant violations of the Standards of Conduct, and the failure to repay the Branch for questionable charges as Branch policies require, the Budget and Finance and Rules Committees recommend that Representative Joaquin resign from the office of Council representative effective immediately and repay the Branch consistent with applicable policies.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED that the Tohono O'odham Legislative Council determines that Representative Timothy L. Joaquin repeatedly violated the Standards of Conduct during his tenure as Legislative Council chairperson and calls on Representative Timothy L. Joaquin to immediately resign from the office of Legislative Council representative and repay the Branch for unauthorized expenditures consistent with applicable policies.

BE IT FINALLY ORDERED that the Tobono O'odham Legislative Council directs the Rules and Budget and Finance Committees, in coordination with the Legislative Council officers, to recommend additional measures and legislation to protect the Nation's assets and strengthen financial accountability.
